The Affordable Care Act (ACA) allowed states to expand Medicaid programs, making health care coverage possible for non-parents under $138 \%$ of the federal poverty level (FPL). Today, approximately 3.7 million Californians have health care coverage in Medi-Cal - California's Medicaid program - because of the Optional Expansion.

## A Snapshot of California's Optional Expansion

This Snapshot is based on our 16 local health plans' data and experience in serving 2.1 million - nearly $60 \%$ - of the 3.7 million Californians covered by Medi-Cal's Optional Expansion.

## MENTAL HEALTH <br> MENTAL HEALTH CONDITIONS

Health plans provide benefits for mild to moderate conditions, while counties provide services for serious mental illnesses and substance use disorder. Nearly 300,000 of Local Plans' Optional Expansion members have a mental health diagnosis, such as depression and/or anxiety.

## Other Observations

- Cancer is another common diagnosis. Additional research is needed to pull complete data.
- Hospital \& ER utilization remained mostly unchanged in the first years, as Optional Expansion members adapted to having health care coverage.
- Today, hospital utilization is trending down as members have grown accustomed to routine primary care and preventive services.
