- 1. A number of plans have indicated their intention to offer some or all of the following ILOS in January 2022:
 - Housing Transition Navigation Services
 - Housing Deposits
 - Housing Tenancy and Sustaining Services
 - Short-Term Hospitalization Housing
 - Recuperative Care (medical respite)
 - Meals/Medically-Tailored Meals

For these ILOS, what is your plan's approach for developing a credentialing-like process for providers or provider organizations interested in serving as ILOS providers? What criteria are plans considering?

 - Personal Care and Homemaker Services
 - Home Modifications
 - Sobering Centers
 - Asthma Remediation
